## **DAILY READING**

#### So, what's happening at St Michael's?

What with successive Covid lockdowns one might be forgiven for thinking that very little is happening at St Michael's.

Nothing is further from the truth; indeed, many of our activities have returned after the relaxation to level 3 and some have continued unabated even in the harshest level of lockdown.

As you know **Church services** have resumed, with the necessary protocols in place. Our **social initiatives such as 123 Club** will probably start again soon, but with some restriction; more about this soon. Whilst many of us have been vaccinated the threat of Covid infection remains and we need to take care.

Our core 'giving' initiatives have continued unabated with many parishioners participating in cash or kind. These include:


- Food hamper project which involves a contribution of R350 per month and which feeds a family of 4 for a fortnight
- **Goody bag Christmas initiative** of toiletries, clothing and goodies for the children of Milimani in Zululand. So far 180 bags have been filled.
- Our Capital Reserve account currently stands at R89700 with a target of R350000, aimed at restoring our Reserve funds which were badly depleted during the severe Covid lockdown.
- Last but not least, the 'Random acts of Kindness' initiative which involves doing something unexpected for a stranger (or even a friend or family member). Whilst this will often involve financial help, equally important would be a prayer, kind word or even a friendly greeting.

It is our prayer that all of our parishioners participate in all of these projects in some way.

## **ST LUKE, THE EVANGELIST**

**St Luke** (1<sup>st</sup> century) Biblical evangelist. Possibly born in Antioch of Gentile Greek parentage, he practiced medicine according to the few details of his life given in the New Testament. He accompanied St Paul on his missionary journeys and was with him when their ship was wrecked off Malta. Paul describes Luke as his only companion in Rome and another source claims he eventually returned to Greece and died unmarried there, aged 84. Another tradition suggests he died a martyr's death. He is credited as the author of the third gospel and of the Acts of the Apostles. He is honoured as the patron saint of physicians, surgeons, butchers and artists. His emblem is a winged ox. *Feast Day: 18 October* 



## **ST JAMES THE BROTHER OF THE LORD**



St. James was the son of Joseph the Betrothed, born of the wife that Joseph had before he was betrothed to the Ever-virgin Mary. Hence he was the brother of the Lord, who was also thought to be the son of Joseph. However, some say that he was a nephew of Joseph, and the son of his brother Cleopas and his wife Mary, who was the first cousin of the Theotokos. But even according to this genealogy, he was still called, according to the idiom of the scriptures, the Lord's brother because of their kinship.

This James is called the less (Mark 15:40) by the Evangelists to distinguish him from James, the son of Zebedee, who was called the Great. He was the first Bishop of Jerusalem, elevated to this Episcopal rank by the Apostles, and was called Obliah, the Just, because of his great holiness and righteousness. St James presided over the Council of Jerusalem at a time in which a major dispute between the Jewish Christians and the Gentile converts was settled. St James was known as a man of prayer. In fact he spent so much time on his knees that they became calloused. Having ascended the crest of the Temple on the day of the Passover at the prompting of all, he bore testimony from there concerning his belief in Jesus, and he proclaimed with a great voice that Jesus sits at the right hand of the great power of God and shall come again upon the clouds of heaven. On hearing this testimony many of those present cried, "Hosanna to the Son of David." *Feast Day: October 23*
