

ST MARY THE VIRGIN

Saint Mary (1st Century) The virgin mother of Christ. According to the Bible, Mary (or Miriam in Hebrew) was descended from the house of King David, although no information is offered about her immediate parents or her place of birth. Having become betrothed to St Joseph, a carpenter of Nazareth, she was visited (at the socalled 'Annunciation') by the angel Gabriel, who informed her that through the power of the Holy spirit she would bear the Messiah, Jesus Christ. Submitting to the will of God, she duly became pregnant. Joseph did not reject her because of the pregnancy and the marriage went ahead. Mary's baby was born while the couple were in Bethlehem to have their names recorded in the official census, after which they evaded the murderous soldiers of Herod seeking out the new-born Saviour and fled to Egypt. The holy family later returned to Nazareth and little is known of their lives over the next few years. Mary reappears., however, at the Feast of Cana (as related at John 2:1-10), during which Christ changed the water into wine at his mother's prompting, and finally at the Crucifixion (John 19:25-27), after which she seems to have been entrusted by Christ to John's care. She prayed with the other apostles at the time of Christ's ascension to heaven (Acts 1:12-14), but is not mentioned again afterwards. Conflicting traditions claim that she died either in Jerusalem or in Ephesus. Roman Catholics believe that Mary was herself born without sin, the product of an 'Immaculate Conception', and that she remained a virgin throughout her marriage. At the end of her life she did not die in the usual way but was transported body and soul to heaven in what is usually dubbed her "Assumption". As the foremost intercessor between humanity and Christ, Mary has been singled out for special devotion since the early history of the Roman Catholic Church and many orders, churches and other organizations have claimed to have experienced visions of Mary or to have benefited from her divine intervention. Mary is variously honoured as the patron saint of numerous countries and organizations and was named patron saint of the entire human race in 1944. Her Annunciation is celebrated on 25 March and her Immaculate Conception on 8 December, while her part in the Incarnation and Redemption is commemorated on 1 January and the Visitation is remembered on 31 May. The feast of Our Lady of Sorrows falls on 15 September. She is also celebrated in numerous local festivals and commemorated in countless placenames.




