Teach us, good Lord, to enjoy the fun of your creation; not to take ourselves too seriously and to allow the sense of humour which is your gift to us to bubble over as it should. **John the Baptist** (d. c.30) Biblical prophet and martyr. Described in the Bible as the forerunner of Christ, John the Baptist was (according to Luke) the child of the elderly Zechariah and his hitherto barren wife Elizabeth, who conceived after the angel Gabriel appeared to her and told her that she would bear a child who would prepare the way for the Messiah. Nothing is known of John's early life until, in his early thirties, he retreated to the desert to fast and pray, dressing in skins and eating only locusts and wild honey. After emerging from the desert he preached the word of God and baptized converts in the river Jordan as a sign of their purification, ultimately baptizing Christ (sometimes identified as John's cousin) himself. Subsequently John was arrested on the orders of King Herod Antipas who feared his preaching might spark a rebellion. Unfortunately John had previously incurred the displeasure of Herod's wife Herodias by condemning their marriage (on the grounds that Herodias had been the wife of Herod's half-brother) and Herodias now plotted revenge against him. Accordingly, she told her daughter Salome to dance before the king and, when as a reward Herod promised Salome anything she desired, told her to ask for John the Baptist's head on a platter. John was duly beheaded and his head served up as proof of his death. He is honoured as the patron saint of farriers, tailors, the Knights Hospitallers and also of Turkey. His emblem is a lamb. Feast Day: 24 June
