So, what's happening at St Michael's?

What with successive Covid lockdowns one might be forgiven for thinking that very little is happening at St Michael's.


Nothing is further from the truth; indeed, many of our activities have returned after the relaxation to level 3 and some have continued unabated even in the harshest level of lockdown.

As you know **Church services** have resumed, with the necessary protocols in place. Our **social initiatives such as 123 Club** will probably start again soon, but with some restriction; more about this soon. Whilst many of us have been vaccinated the threat of Covid infection remains and we need to take care.

Our core 'giving' initiatives have continued unabated with many parishioners participating in cash or kind. These include:

- **Food hamper project** which involves a contribution of R350 per month and which feeds a family of 4 for a fortnight
- **Goody bag Christmas initiative** of toiletries, clothing and goodies for the children of Milimani in Zululand. So far 60 bags have been filled with a further 90 to come.
- Our Capital Reserve account currently stands at R83200 with a target of R350000, aimed at restoring our Reserve funds which were badly depleted during the severe Covid lockdown.
- Last but not least, the **'Random acts of Kindness'** initiative which involves doing something unexpected for a stranger (or even a friend or family member). Whilst this will often involve financial help, equally important would be a prayer, kind word or even a friendly greeting.

It is our prayer that all of our parishioners participate in all of these projects in some way.



Saint Augustine of Hippo (350-430) Bishop and theologian. Born in Tagaste (modern Algeria) in North Africa, the son of a pagan father, Augustine lived a dissolute youth that he subsequently came to repent. He founded a school of rhetoric in Milan in 383 and soon began to feel the need to reform, finally converting to Christianity in 386 while in Milan, Italy (partly through the influence of the teachings of St Ambrose). He returned to Africa that same year and was ordained a priest at Hippo in 391. He was raised to the rank of bishop in 396 and for the next four decades won recognition as the most prominent figure in the North African church. He founded a number of monasteries and also defended the orthodox position against various heresies. His extensive writings, which included Confessions, an account of his immoral early life, and On the City of God, a defence of faith written at a time when Rome was under siege by the Goths in 410, had a profound and lasting influence upon Christian theology. He died in Hippo while the city was being besieged by the Vandals. Considered second only to St Paul as the most influential figure in the early history of the Christian Church, Augustine is revered as both Western Father of the Church and Doctor of the Church. He is also honoured as the patron saint of theologians. His emblem is a pierced, broken or burning heart. Feast Day: 28 August
